# The South African Heritage Resources Information System – expansions across Africa and practical applications of the data

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#### Introduction to SAHRIS

- The National Monuments Council (NMC) was replaced by SAHRA in 2000. This followed the promulgation of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)
- The NMC was focused mainly on declaring colonial buildings around 2500 were declared.
- Only about 50 archaeological sites were declared up to 1999.
- The NHRA followed the White Paper on Arts, Culture and Heritage in 1996. It was extensively debated over many workshops.
- The NHRA embraced 'New Public Management' ideas from various countries in the 1990s.
- Decision-making powers would be devolved to local level in a three-tiered heritage management system (national, provincial, local).
- The NHRA embraced all forms of heritage, especially as a means to address the gaps created during Apartheid
- There were at least four unsuccessful attempts to develop SAHRIS between 2000 & 2011

#### What is SAHRIS and what is it used for?

- SAHRIS is a national heritage management system
- Its overarching purpose is to provide a means to record and disseminate information of heritage resources in South Africa
- It fulfills various legislative requirements stipulated in the NHRA
- It provides a digital management system for all heritage management functions such as permits, heritage case management, heritage object management and public participation
- It serves as a national sites repository
- It provides a collections management system for museums and other bodies
- It was built on Drupal and Geoserver, both are free open source software
- It currently has two NAS Servers with 46 Terabytes of replicated storage available

#### **Incentives**

Data is currently captured onto SAHRIS and disseminated through the following channels:

management processes)

- **RESEARCH** UCT, KZN Museum, eCRAG etc




To login, users go to the home page and click on Login at the top left.

We recommend using **Google** Chrome.




Home page of SAHRIS once logged in - Dashboard










#### THE VOORTREKKER MONUMENT – site reference




#### THE VOORTREKKER MONUMENT – site recording




#### Map view of sites




#### Palaeontological Sensitivity Map




#### Palaeontological Sensitivity Map - Gauteng







#### HERITAGE SCREENERS



A Heritage Screener is a **summary assessment** of all known heritage resources in an area proposed for development. It contains a set of recommendations, detailed maps and all known heritage data relevant to the proposed application.

Heritage Screeners lead to more predictable outcomes for applicants and are specifically designed in line with the statutory requirements of the **National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)**.


We assess heritage impact assessments (HIAs) and research previously undertaken in the area of the proposed development and its surroundings in order to extract and map all heritage resources identified. The heritage resources are described in terms of type and significance according to the original assessment. A screener is delivered within **24 hours** of application.

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#### (1) The heritage resources in the area proposed for development are sufficiently recorded

The surveys undertaken in the area adequately captured the heritage resources. There are no known sites which require mitigation or management plans. No further heritage work is recommended for the proposed development.

This recommendation is made when:

- enough work has been undertaken in the area
- it is the professional opinion of CTS that the area has already been assessed adequately from a heritage perspective for the type of development proposed.

#### (2) The heritage resources and the area proposed for development are only partially recorded

The surveys undertaken in the area have not adequately captured the heritage resources and/or there are sites which require mitigation or management plans. Further specific heritage work is recommended for the proposed development.

This recommendation is made in instances in which there are already some studies undertaken in the area and/or in the adjacent area for the proposed development.

Further studies in a limited HIA may include:

- improvement on some components of the heritage assessments already undertaken, for instance with a renewed field survey and/or with a specific specialist for the type of heritage resources expected in the area
- compilation of a report for a component of a heritage impact assessment not already undertaken in the area
- undertaking mitigation measures requested in previous assessments/records of decision.

# (3) The heritage resources within the area proposed for the development have not been adequately surveyed yet

Few or no surveys have been undertaken in the area proposed for development. A full Heritage Impact Assessment with a detailed field component is recommended for the proposed development.

The responsibility for generating a response detailing the requirements for the development lies with the heritage authority. However, since the methodology utilised for the compilation of the Heritage Screeners is thorough and consistent, contradictory outcomes to the recommendations made by CTS should rarely occur. Should a discrepancy arise, CTS will immediately take up the matter with the heritage authority to clarify the dispute.
